Brief Overview

Does "restorative justice" seem like an unattainable ideal, a "buzz word" in your school that seems impossible to actualize in your classroom? Do students' attitudes and behavior seem to hijack the rich teaching you hope to accomplish? Are you aware of students' traumatic experiences and interpersonal dynamics interfering with their learning?



This course helps teachers to develop and employ classroom routines,

procedures, norms, and supports for positive behavior to ensure a classroom climate in which all students can learn. The course addresses preemptive practices, optimal decision-making in responding to problematic behavior, ways to ensure humanizing affirmation of all students while repairing relationship rifts, and ways to effectively work with students' support networks, including students' family members and members of the school community.

Course is entirely online, with multimedia content, quizzes, open-responses, discussion forums, and a final project involving a summary of course learning.
